Nature Notes

July in the Nature-Friendly Garden

Having had so much rain since autumn, it is odd that it is now getting dry. I had forgotten just how much water pots need and, now they are full of growth, the rain that falls, misses most of the pot, unfortunately. I have taken so much pleasure in the healthy garden growth this year, especially in the 'lawn' areas. So many wild flowers are naturalising and some of the seeds I planted in the winter are now adding to the display.

We see foxes in the garden almost every day, a pair and a scruffy singleton. Pete watched two young magpies teasing a cat on the store roof. The cat likes the sun and the magpies like insects in the crevices. One magpie was in front, taunting the cat, while the other was behind pecking at his tail. The cat would have a pounce at a bird, who would go away for a bit, then come back and it would start again. Eventually the cat got up and went away. Magpies 1, Cat nil!

Plant of the month

The pea flowers and vetches are wonderful this year. Birdsfoot trefoil has been late and, at the time of writing, been out less than a week. But my pride and joy has come from a tiny magenta pea flower, grass vetchling. It appears to float within grass stems, a true meadow plant I am thrilled to have. I will collect seeds for larger sowings next year.

Job of the month

We both have suffered from Covid, which came as a horrible shock, as we have taken all our vaccinations. We are having nasty long-lasting side effects, including muscle pain and weakness which has prevented us from doing much, so I don't feel inclined to tell you all what you should be doing! I will get round to trimming edges and cutting some areas of grass down, but the floriferous areas are proving magnets to insects with pollen and nectar so I shall keep it long for a while.

Try to conserve water for the next few drier months to keep shrubs and trees happy. Enjoy your outside spaces, including balconies, as shown on the Chelsea Flower Show exhibitions. I found a lot of the thinking at Chelsea very inspiring this year as so many people championed Wildlife Friendly Gardening.

No 4 A cycle trip to Wormshill

I leave Newington Station on a journey suggested by Joe Ennis. Climbing through the lanes, I pass hedgerows frothed up with cow parsley while young rabbits skedaddle away. I cross onto a quiet road and am greeted by passing cyclists - a long way from the chaos of Stockbury Roundabout a few miles away. A dusty track takes me into Oad Street. I am tempted to drop in at the village cafe but resist and push on, passing old cherry orchards. The tree trunks are swollen after routine pruning over many years. Kent's old cherry orchards harbour the rare noble chafer beetle, a striking, metallic-green insect that relies on decaying wood in living trees. But mature orchards now have little commercial value, dwarf trees being favoured. Old orchards, like the ones I am passing, are rapidly vanishing.

The road climbs again, alongside fields of ripening wheat, before I swing onto Bicknor Lane. Blackbirds alert me to a kestrel sailing over on the hunt for voles. A chaffinch serenades me into Wormshill village with a descending trill, a greenfinch rasps and wheezes from a tree beyond and, opposite a field of buttercups, sits St Giles church, mentioned in the Domesday Book. A robin has found a home amid the ancient oak topmost rafters of the beautiful porch.

Churchyards are some of our most important meadow habitats. Many have escaped modern chemicals/over-zealous management and are

pockets of botanical beauty worthy of any nature reserve. Along with flowers like cowslips, ox-eye daisies and orchids, old churchyards support an array of insects. A small copper, one of my favourite butterflies, suns itself on an old, partly buried headstone. It's burnt orange and black spotted wings flick gently, warming up flight muscles in the sun. I wander, admiring the lichens and tufty mosses on old headstones, many dating from the 17th century. The average church-yard can support over 100 species of lichen, some of which survive nowhere else. The charity, Caring for Gods Acre, raises awareness of the importance of churchyards for nature, encouraging people to get involved caring for them.

My bike against an old flint wall, I settle in shade to eat my sandwiches, watching as a wood mouse scurries along the base of the wall, eyeing me nervously before disappearing. I leave it a tiny bit of cheese. I return through the Hucking Estate, an area of ancient woodlands running along the North Downs. Jackdaws chime across the valley, their calls sounding like two flints being struck together but perhaps that is due to the countless flint walled cottages passed today. Swallows are hawking for insects, skimming in my slipstream, so close I could reach and grab one. The road bowls endlessly downhill, a reward for this morning's hill climbs and the Borden valley opens up around me. It is a lovely way to end a rewarding day's cycle in the countryside.

<u>Banking in Rainham</u>

The last bank in Rainham, the Natwest branch is closing on 24 July 2024.

Until the last decade all the major banks were represented in town and, in the 1980s, even smaller building societies opened branches or had agencies within local estate agents. The consolidation of banks since the 1990s and the rise of digital banking has reversed that trend and now only Nationwide Building Society remains. They've pledged to remain in all existing locations until at least 2028 but who knows what might happen then.

The cover photograph of the old 55 High Street building was taken around 1961 and Westminster Bank remained operating from there until 1973 when it relocated to 70 High Street - the branch's current premises on the corner of Orchard Street.

Westminster Bank later merged with National Provincial Bank, operating as National Westminster Bank from 1 January 1970.

There are also some photos of the 70 High Street branch over the years on the Rainham History website.

Help Stop 2000 Houses at Lidsing

Bredhurst Parish Council (BPC) continues its High Court legal challenge against MBC (Maidstone Borough Council). 2000 new houses at Lidsing with virtually no infrastructure will force Medway Council to provide nearly all amenities, despite being already overstretched.

The development faces strong opposition. A Judicial Review is the only way to stop the development. Legal action began in April, papers have been lodged at the High Court and are currently being considered by a Judge. If the case goes according to plan, a full High Court hearing could take place in around four months' time.

This is a huge undertaking for tiny BPC but, with the tremendous support of residents across Medway and Maidstone, funds have been raised to allow the legal action. They are about £25,000 short so urgently need your help! All donations large or small will be much appreciated.

Food, glorious food... even the stuff you can't eat!

Did you know that the average bin bag in Medway is made up of 30% food waste? Why does that matter?

There are a number of reasons:

* Food disposed of in a black sack goes to waste, creating harmful gases including CO2, carbon monoxide and methane.
* Food disposed in a black sack is very attractive to rats and foxes, leaving streets

regularly covered in rubbish, including dirty nappies.

* Council funding is then needed to clean it

up, reducing what could be spent elsewhere. Astonishingly, around a third of all food produced for human consumption is wasted per year, globally.

So what is the alternative?

- * Less rubbish
- * Less foxes
- * Money earned from the compost made
- * More council money available for alternative spending

What can you do?

* Collect a free 5 litre food caddy from your nearest library and start collecting food waste * Put it into your brown bin for collection with the garden waste each week - instead of it being wasted we make it into compost to grow new crops - brilliant!

Your brown bin takes:

- Grass cuttings
- Prunings and weeds
- Leaves and foliage
- Small branches

• Food waste, including meat, fish, bones (no plastic bags)

- Raw & cooked food (fruit & veg peel)
- Teabags & coffee grinds
- Perished food
- Plate scrapings
